

South and Central America Project

Señorita Castillo needs to make Spring break plans for this year, and she isn't sure where to go. This is where you come in. You are a travel agent, and you will provide Señorita Castillo with all of the information that she might need to choose a destination for her vacation. You will create a 5-slide presentation (google slides works well) to convince her to choose your country.

Each slide must contain the following information:

Title Slide: Your names, your class period, name of country, teacher's name

Slide 1 Information: Name of country, flag of country, map of country (location in continent), capital city, official language(s), time zone(s), currency (and exchange rate).

Slide 2 Cities: Names of 3 interesting cities that have attractions for Señorita Castillo to see. List attractions and what makes them fun! - Provide pictures.

Slide 3 Food: Names, pictures, and ingredients of three traditional foods eaten in the country. Should be a combination of: breakfast, lunch, dinner, or dessert. Also, common drinks consumed in the country. Are there any specific rules about how these people eat - big meals in the morning? Do they eat at different times of day than we do?

Slide 4 Culture: What do citizens of this country do for fun? Sports? What do citizens spend their time doing? Types of jobs? Religion? Musical genres? Dance? What do these people wear? Provide pictures. What holidays do they celebrate?

Slide 5 Fun Facts: What are some interesting facts about your country, its inhabitants, or specific cities in your country? Provide at least 4.

Slide 6 Photo gallery: Provide at least 5 photos (WITH CAPTIONS GIVING EXPLANATIONS) of things in your country. Can be attractions, architecture, landscapes, animals, people, festivals, etc.

The country that Señorita Castillo chooses to visit will be up to you, so be convincing! The best presentation (country that she picks) may receive a prize!

Rubric:

Completion: 20% - are all of the slides present and fully completed with all of the requirements?

Information: 30% - is information accurate, and is there enough of it?

Style: 10% - is the presentation neat and aesthetically pleasing? Does it contain enough pictures?

Delivery: 20% - Do the group members deliver the information well to the class/teacher?

Pasaporte: 20% - Did the student fill out their pasaporte completely and accurately?
